However, after the concert I recorded an interview with the band, down at URB and this will be broadcast in the next week or so, listen out for it — for


details listen to my show on Friday (5.00pm – 6.00pm) (PLUG, PLUG)



## TUITION FEES FOR REPEAT STUDENTS
